BIBLE BOWL -2016

Lesson #8 –Four Judges

Scripture Reading: Judges 3:12-14

Introduction:

- 1. The vicious cycle of sin the Israelites were caught in.
- 2. There are lessons to be learned from the Judges.
- 3. In this lesson we will examine four Judges and learn from their experiences.

I. JUDGE OTHNIEL -3:7-11

- A. THE TROUBLE ARISES
 - 1. They forgot the Lord and served the Baals and Ashtoreth
 - a. They were not to have any other gods before the Living God Ex 20:3
 - b. The Baal –"the sun god"
 - c. Ashtoreth -- "the moon goddess"
 - 2. God had sold them into the hands of the king of Mesopotamia. They served him for eight years.
- B. GOD ANSWERS THEIR CRIES FOR HELP
 - 1. God sends Othniel.
 - 2. Othniel is Caleb's nephew who later became his son-in-law (Joshua 15:13-19)

II. JUDGE EHUD -3:12-30

- A. THE TROUBLE ARISES
 - 1. The children of Israel did evil in the sight of the Lord
 - 2. The Lord sold them into the hands of Eglon the king of Moab.
 - 3. They served for eighteen years
- B. EHUD CONQUERS THE MOABITES
 - 1. Ehud brought tribute to the king and had established trust with him.
 - 2. He brought a secret message from God
 - a. Everyone else was sent out from their presence
 - b. Ehud stabbed him with a double-edged dagger
 - 3. After the battle was won, the land had rest for eighty years -3:30

III. JUDGE SHAMGAR -3:31

- A. HIS GREAT MIGHT
 - 1. He killed six-hundred men with an ox goad
 - 2. He did so without the great strength of Samson
- B. APPLICATION
 - 1. One does not have to have the great strength of Samson or the Wisdom of Solomon to accomplish great things for the Lord.
 - 2. One only has to put their faith and trust in the Lord and be motivated to action.

IV. JUDGE DEBORAH -4:1-24

- A. THE TROUBLE ARISES
 - 1. The children of Israel did evil in the sight of the Lord and were sold under the hand of Jabin.
 - 2. Jabin had 900 chariots of iron -4:3 (We come back to this point)
- B. GOD DEFEATS THEIR ENEMY
 - 1. Deborah tells Barak to go out and conquer the enemy -vs. 6-7
 - 2. Barak refuses to go without her; therefore the glory of battle would go to a woman

- 3. The chariots of iron were no match for the mighty hand of God -13-16
 - a. Some criticize the Bible for Judges 1:19. They believe God could not overcome chariots b. This verse shows the fallacy of their perspective.
- C. DEATH OF SISERA -vs. 17-22
 - 1. He fled away on foot to the tent of Jael
 - 2. He thought he was in a place of shelter
 - 3. She drove a tent peg through his temple while he slept.

Conclusion:

- 1. Our promise land is heaven itself
- 2. We are not called upon to kill physical enemies, but rather to defeat sin in our lives.
