Lesson #14 – From Hope to Redemption Scripture Reading: Ruth 3:1-5

Introduction:

- 1. Brief review of chapters one and two.
- 2. Redemption is for those who endure to the very end.
- 3. We will examine how Ruth went from the glimmer of hope to the reality of redemption.

I. THE ACTIONS OF RUTH

- A. SHE HEARS THE WORDS OF NAOMI -3:1-5
 - 1. She prepares herself to lie at Boaz's feet
 - 2. She is then to hear his instructions and follow what he says to do

B. SHE FOLLOWS -3:6-9

- 1. She lies at his feet
- 2. He is startled by her presence
- 3. She asks him to take her under his wing

II. THE ACTIONS OF BOAZ

- A. HE IS AMAZED BY HER
 - 1. With her choice for security -3:10
 - 2. Everyone in town knows she is virtuous -3:11

B. HE GIVES HER ASSURANCE

- 1. There is a relative closer than he. Boaz will conform to the Law of Moses
- 2. He is going to tend to the matter immediately -3:13
- 3. He gives her six ephahs of barley so she does not return empty handed -3:15-17
- 4. Naomi knows the nature of Boaz -3:18

C. HE GIVES THE CLOSER RELATIVE A CHANCE TO PERFORM HIS DUTY -4:1-8

- 1. They meet at the city gate with the elders of the city
- 2. The closer relative agrees to buy the land, but not to the marriage of Ruth
- 3. His sandal is removed -Ref. De 25:5-9

D. BOAZ FULFILLS HIS PROMISE -4:9-12

- 1. He confirms his oath before the city elders –vs. 9-10
- 2. They bless him -vs. 11-12

III. THE FINAL RESULTS -4:13-22

- A. RUTH FINDS SECURITY AND BLESSING
 - 1. She is married to Boaz
 - 2. She gives birth to Obed who becomes the grandfather of King David
 - 3. Ultimately she is in the linage of Christ –Mt 1:5

B. APPLICATION FOR US TODAY

- 1. Ruth was a Moabite who found place in the linage of Christ because of her devotion
- 2. Today, whosoever will can be in the family of God
 - a. When they devote themselves to God
 - b. When they are obedient to the gospel of Jesus Christ -Ac 2:38, Ro 6:3-4
 - c. When they are faithful unto God until their very last breath –Re 2:10

Conclusion:

- 1. The book of Ruth is a powerful story of love, devotion, and redemption.
- 2. This book gives hope to the lost.
 - a. When they have a heart of devotion toward God and follow faithfully to His words, they find redemption
 - b. They also can become a part of the spiritual family of God -1Jn 3:1-3, Ro 8:16-17
