ACTS OF THE APOSTLES Lesson #5 -Of God or Man? Scripture Reading: Acts 5:38-42

Introduction:

- 1. Know your roots / foundation. The book of Acts shows the beginning history of the church we are now a part of!
- 2. The church of Christ is a work of God, not of man!
- 3. In this lesson we will observe some providential evidence that supports this claim.

I. GAMALIEL'S ADVICE -5:33-39

- A. TWO MEN CLAIMING GREATNESS
 - 1. Theudas -5:35, 36
 - a. All we know about Theudas is the contents of this verse
 - b. Josephus mentions a Theudas who led a revolt. His revolt however, occurred between ten and fifteen years later.
 - 2. Judas of Galilee -5:37
 - a. He led a revolt against the taxation of Caesar in 6 AD
 - b. His work was destroyed by the Romans
 - c. His sons were executed. What exactly happened to him is unclear, but we know he did perish.

B. HIS CONCLUSION

- 1. If the plan or work is of man, it will surely perish and come to naught.
- 2. If this plan or work is of God however, one will never be able to stop it!
 - a. Keep in mind Gamaliel is not a believer in Christ, nor a supporter of the apostles.
 - b. He is using his wisdom to arrive at a logical conclusion concerning these men.

In the previous verses, Luke reveals to his readers whether this work is of God or man; observe...

II. ANANIAS AND SAPPHIRA -5:1-11

- A. THEIR DEED
 - 1. They had a plot of land and sold it, but kept back a portion for themselves.
 - a. Nothing was wrong in this action. The money was theirs. -5:4
 - b. Perhaps they were wanting to look good in the eyes of man -4:36, 37
 - 2. Ananias laid a portion of the proceeds at the apostles feet, claiming it was the full amount.

B. THEIR PUNISHMENT

- 1. Ananias was struck dead at the apostles feet -5:5, 6
- 2. Sapphira also lied to the Holy Spirit and died -5:7-10
- 3. NOTE: The immediate death of this husband and wife shows this is the power of God and not of man!

III. THE CONTINUING POWER IN THE CHURCH

- A. THE SIGNS AND WONDERS -5:12-16
 - 1. We observed the speaking in tongues (Acts 2) and the healing of the lame man (Acts 3)
 - 2. Luke reveals that many signs were done through the apostles
 - a. Many wanting the shadow of Peter to fall on them -vs 15
 - b. Unclean spirits were cast out -vs 16
- B. THE APOSTLES SET FREE -5:17-21
 - 1. The high priest and the Sadducees were angry with the apostle and imprisoned them.
 - 2. An angel of the Lord sets them free and tells them to preach to the people in the temple
- C. ON TRIAL AGAIN -5:22-32
 - 1. The apostles cannot be found in the prison, but are in the temple preaching the word!
 - 2. They are brought before the council without violence for fear of the people
 - 3. They are reminded to stop preaching Jesus as the Christ -vs. 28
 - 4. "We ought to obey God rather than men!" -vs 29
 - 5. They consented to the death of Christ. Through Him however, they can find repentance and forgiveness for their souls.

Conclusion:

- 1. Despite all the efforts to stomp out the Christian teaching, the apostles would not be stopped!
- 2. They beat the apostles and commanded them to stop preaching in the name of Jesus -vs. 40
- 3. They rejoiced for being counted worthy to suffer for Christ -vs. 41
- 4. They continued to teach and preach -vs. 42
- 5. Today, we continue to be this church that belongs to Christ. It is great joy to know that God's hand is in His kingdom both then and now!
