Lesson #7 -The Boldness of Philip

Scripture Reading: Acts 8:1-4

Introduction:

- 1. We must never faint in the day of adversity -Pr 24:10
- 2. Philip was bold in the face of adversity and many souls were saved.
- 3. In this lesson we will examine the effects of Philip's boldness...

I. <u>HE WAS BOLD IN THE FACE OF PERSECUTION</u>

- A. SAUL MADE HAVOC AGAINST THE CHURCH
 - 1. He dragged both men and women out of their homes and into prison -8:3
 - 2. The people scattered and preached the word -8:4
- B. PHILIP'S BOLDNESS
 - 1. He was one of the seven chosen to serve -6:1-7
 - a. He was full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom -vs. 3
 - b. He also was of good reputation -vs. 3
 - 2. He did not allow persecution to prevent him from preaching the gospel -8:5
 - a. He confirmed the word with great miracles -vs. 6, 7
 - b. The result: there was great joy in the city -vs. 8

II. SOUL'S SAVED AT THE PREACHING OF PHILIP

- A. SIMON THE SORCERER -8:9-25
 - 1. Many thought him to be "the great power of God"
 - 2. He believed and was baptized -8:13
 - 3. He thought he could purchase the power of God with money -vs. 19
 - 4. Three observations concerning Simon:
 - a. We have to die unto sin -Co 3:9, 10
 - b. Even Christians can sin and fall short of God's glory -1Co 10:12, 13
 - c. In such cases, one must repent and pray for forgiveness -Ac 8:22
- B. THE ETHIOPIAN EUNUCH -8:26-40
 - 1. The angel of the Lord instructs Philip where he should go -8:26
 - 2. The description of the Ethiopian eunuch -8:27
 - a. He had great authority under Queen Candace
 - b. He was in charge of the Queen's treasury
 - 3. He was reading from the prophet Isaiah -Is 53:7, 8
 - 4. From this passage, Philip preaches to him Jesus
 - 5. One cannot preach Jesus without the knowledge of baptism
 - 6. Philip baptizes him and he goes his way rejoicing -8:38, 39

Conclusion:

- 1. From these events we ascertain the importance of remaining bold in the face of adversity
- 2. Souls can always be brought to Jesus even when the message is not popular -Ref. 2Ti 4:2
