ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

Lesson #21 -Recount of Paul's Conversion

Scripture Reading: Acts 22:12-16

Introduction:

- 1. The Jews were beating Paul. He now tries to persuade them to come to Christ.
- 2. Paul's great desire is for others to convert to Christ just as he had.

I. HIS FORMER LIFE -22:1-5

- A. His zeal for the Law
 - 1. He was trained at the feet of Gamaliel
 - a. He was a teacher of the law -Ac 5:34
 - b. He was held in respect by all the people
 - c. He was a leader who took charge of the situation with the apostles
 - 2. He had the same zeal for the law as they are displaying
- B. He persecuted Christians
 - 1. He persecuted them to the point of death
 - 2. He put both men and women into prison
 - 3. The high priest bear witness of Paul's previous zeal against the Way
 - a. He received letters from the high priest to bind those in Damascus and bring them back to Jerusalem.
 - b. No one could honestly doubt the zeal for the law the overflowed in the heart of Saul

II. HIS CONVERSION

- A. Road to Damascus -22:6-11
 - 1. People knew that Paul was coming to Damascus to persecute Christians -9:14
 - 2. The Lord appeared to him in a light from heaven
 - a. Saul was persecuting Jesus, not the church
 - b. Those with Saul saw the light, heard the voice, but could not understand what was being said.
 - 3. Paul knew something needed to be done
 - a. He realized the gravity of his predicament
 - b. He was told to enter Damascus and it would be told him what he must do.
- B. Instructions for Salvation Given -22:12-16
 - 1. Ananias lays hands on him to restore his sight
 - 2. He informs Saul that he will know God's will and testify of Him.
 - 3. He was told to rise and be baptized -vs. 22

III. HIS TRANSFORMATION

- A. He preached the gospel
 - 1. Those in Jerusalem would not receive him; Jesus tells him to depart
 - 2. Paul believes that if the people could see his transformation, they would believes
 - a. He reminds the crowd of his former life
 - b. He reminds them of his consent against Steven
 - 3. The Lord makes it clear that they will not receive him. They saw him as a traitor.

- 4. The Lord sends Paul to the Gentiles. This sets off the crowd against Paul.
- B. Application of Paul's recount of his conversion
 - 1. Everyone has had sin in their life -Ro 6:23; 1Jn 1:8-10
 - 2. Transformation through the blood of Jesus is possible
 - a. We have redemption through His blood -Ep 1:7
 - b. God's love was demonstrated for us through His death on the cross -Ro 5:6-9
 - c. We are cleansed when buried with Christ in baptism for the remission of sins.
 - 3. Anyone with the heart and desire to change their life and live for Jesus can.

Conclusion:

- 1. The death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus changes lives.
- 2. Don't allow the past to dictate your future!
