STATEMENTS FROM THE CROSS

Lesson #3 -Behold Your Mother Scripture Reading: John 19:25-27

Introduction:

- 1. It can be difficult to think of the needs of others when we are in distress.
- 2. Even through the death of Jesus He was still thinking of the needs of others.

I. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- A. EXTERNAL OBSERVATIONS
 - 1. John and Mary were at the cross of Jesus
 - a. He loved His mother and John was called "The disciple whom Jesus loved"
 - b. Their devotion for Jesus was clearly seen
 - 2. Joseph most likely had passed away
 - a. Last mention of him was in Lk 2:41-52
 - b. It was only His mother and brothers seeking Him later -Lk 8:19-21
 - 3. The brothers of Jesus did not believe Him -Jn 7:5
 - 4. Some question, "Did John have a home in Jerusalem?" -This is unknown
 - 5. It is likely that John did not lead Mary away from the cross right then. John gave additional eyewitness account after His statement.

B. OTHER OBSERVATIONS

- 1. Remember Simon's prophecy -Lk 2:34, 35
- 2. Mary is now at the foot of the cross; she can do nothing for her Son.

II. TWO ROLES OF JESUS

- A. HE IS HER SON
 - 1. He seeks to provide for her physical needs through John
 - 2. Honor father and mother was from the Law -Ex 20:12
 - 3. The Pharisees failed to honor their parents -Mt 15:1-9
 - 4. We are to provide for our households today -1Ti 5:8

B. HE IS HER SAVIOR

- 1. Mary was in need of salvation as the rest of us are.
 - a. All have sinned and fallen short... -Ro 3:23
 - b. Some try and immortalize her. In response, we cannot ignore her either.
- 2. The pain and agony that Jesus endured kept Mary and the world from hell.

Conclusion:

- 1. Jesus is our Savior today!
- 2. Through His precious blood we are cleansed
- 3. Through obedience to the gospel, we come in contact with the blood of Jesus
