# A FATHER'S EXAMPLE

## Scripture Reading: Matthew 7:7-11

## Introduction:

- 1. Many grow up with the desire to be like their father.
- 2. The example of our earthly fathers reveals certain aspects of the nature of our heavenly Father.
- 3. What are some of the aspects of the heavenly Father we observe?

### I. PROVISION

## A. EARTHLY FATHERS

- 1. Fathers earn a living and provide for their own -1Th 5:8
- 2. Fathers know how to give good gifts to their children -Mt 7:7-11

## B. OUR HEAVENLY FATHER

- 1. God provided for the needs of His people in the wilderness -De 8:3, 4
- 2. The Psalmist, "...I have not seen the righteous forsaken..." -Ps 37:25
- 3. The apostle Paul -Ph 4:11-20

## II. EXPECTATION

#### A. EARTHLY FATHERS

- 1. Training their children in the ways of God
  - a. As Paul stated -Ep 6:4
  - b. As Moses also said -De 6:6-9
- 2. The desire for a godly father is for their children to know Christ, and become like Him.

## B. OUR HEAVENLY FATHER

- 1. His expectation is for His people to grow spiritually
  - a. Are you still without understanding -Mt 15:16
  - b. If you have seen Jesus, you have seen the Father -Jn 14:9-11
  - c. We should not be satisfied with milk, but move on to the meat -He 5:12-14
- 2. We have the same expectation for our children to grow physically

## III. FORGIVENESS

## A. EARTHLY FATHERS

- 1. Children make mistakes, but find forgiveness
- 2. David and Absalom
  - a. Absalom commits treason against his father David -2Sa 15:1-ff
  - b. David later mourns over his son's death -2Sa 18:33

## B. OUR HEAVENLY FATHER

- 1. Remember the father of the Prodigal son -Lk 15:20-24
- 2. Remember the example of Paul
  - a. He stated he was not worthy to be called an apostle -1Co 15:9
  - b. He called himself the chief among sinners -1Ti 1:15

- 1. Our earthly fathers gives us an example of our heavenly Father through provision, expectation, and forgiveness.
- 2. Our heavenly Father wants what is best for us.
  - a. He sent us His Son that through Him we could have life everlasting.
