## MOSES' ERROR AT KADESH

Scripture Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:1-5

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Introduction:

- 1. We can learn from our own mistakes and from the mistakes of others.
- 2. The purpose in this lesson is not to point the finger at Moses, nor is it to arrogantly think we would do better in his place.

Proposition: We must trust and obey the Lord always.

Interrogative: What does the error of Moses teach us to be better Christians today? Transition: In this lesson we will consider two primary times we must obey our Lord

## I. WHEN THE WORLD CONTENDS WITH US -Nu 20:2-6

- A. MOSES' DAY
  - 1. The people complained about having no water.
  - 2. They claimed it would have been better to have died.
- B. OUR DAY
  - 1. The world tries to make us conform to its evil ways
  - 2. This we cannot do. -Mt 5:13-16; Ph 2:15
  - 3. Opposing religious views -E.g. Jews -Ac 17:1-11

## II. WHEN THE LORD COMMANDS US -Nu 20:7-11

- A. MOSES' DAY
  - 1. His command: Take your rod, Aaron, and speak to the rock.
  - 2. His promise: The rock will yield its water (The rock was Christ -1Co 10:4)
  - 3. Instead, Moses struck the rock twice. -cf. Ex. 17:1-7
- B. OUR DAY
  - 1. God has given us commands with promises
    - a. Mk 16:16; Re 2:10
    - b. Co 3:1-4
  - 2. There isn't a trivial misdemeanor with God. Any sin will keep us out of the kingdom of God. -E.g. "Life with Father"
- C. NOTE THE CONSEQUENCES
  - 1. He did not believe or hallow God in the sight of the people.
  - 2. He was kept out of the Promised Land -De 3:23-29.

Conclusion: When we learn from the mistake Moses made, we will observe...

- 1. We must never give in to the pressures of our culture.
- 2. We must never view any sin as too trivial to keep us from heaven.
