THROUGH THE EYES OF THE PRODIGAL

Scripture Reading: Luke 15:1-7

Introduction:

1. Fathers are not perfect, but they have a great love for their children and always seek their best interest.

2. Our heavenly Father is perfect in all His ways. Today in our lesson, we focus on Him.

Proposition: We see the love of the Father through the eyes of the prodigal son.

Interrogative: What can we learn of the love of the Father from the prodigal?

Transition: In this lesson we will see 3 characteristics of the Fathers' love...

I. THE FATHER HOLDS NO ONE AGAINST THEIR WILL -vs. 11-16

- A. HE LET THE PRODIGAL GO UPON ASKING
 - 1. The Father divided up the goods and let him go his way.
 - 2. The son wastes his inheritance and begins to be in want.
 - 3. The son hits rock bottom and looks back to the Father.
- B. WE SERVE OUR HEAVENLY FATHER BY CHOICE
 - 1. God has always given man a choice -De 30:19-20, Jo 24:15, Ez 18:30-32, Mt 7:13-14
 - 2. Christians have a choice to make today -1Co 15:1-4, Re 2:10

II. THE FATHER REJOICES IN REPENTANCE -vs. 17-24

- A. THE SON'S HEART OF REPENTANCE
 - 1. He practiced his speech vs. 18-19
 - 2. He went back to the Father in humility and with a penitent heart.
- B. THE FATHER'S RESPONSE
 - 1. Heart full of compassion
 - 2. Would not hear the rehearsed speech, but rather ordered a feast to be made in His son's honor.
 - 3. The Father longs for the lost to repent and come to Him -2Pe 3:9, 1Ti 2:3-4

III. THE FATHER WANTS ALL TO REJOICE -vs. 25-32

- A. THE FATHER LEAVES THE PARTY
 - 1. When the oldest son refused to come in
 - a. He wants the best from His followers
 - b. He desires the oldest son to be loving and forgiving
 - 2. To listen and correct the oldest brothers thinking
 - a. The oldest son makes his plea vs. 29-30
 - b. The Father responds vs. 31-32
 - 3. The older brother represents the Pharisees and scribes mentioned earlier -Lk 15:1-2
- B. CHRISTIANS TODAY ARE TO REJOICE
 - 1. We seek to restore the wandering -2Co 2:6-11, Ga 6:1, Ja 5:19-20, Jude 1:22-23
 - 2. We must avoid the attitude of the scribes and Pharisees -Note: Jn 8:1-12 (specifically vs. 3, 7)

Conclusion:

- 1. We must have the love of the Father for the lost in our hearts.
- 2. God desires all to be saved. Extend the invitation to any that are not Christians.
