#### Introduction:

1. E.g. -MacGyver could take little objects and accomplish amazing task with them.

2. With God, amazing things can be done with what we have been given.

Proposition: God has given each of us something we can and should use for God.

Interrogative: What do we have in our hands?

Transition: To see what God has given, let us consider...

# I. WHAT HE GAVE TO OTHERS IN SCRIPTURE

#### A. MOSES

- 1. He held a rod in his hand -Ex 4:1-5
- 2. Nothing significant in itself, but powerful when God is in it.
- 3. Generations later remembered the power of God
  - a. Rahab -Jo 2:9-11
  - b. Philistines -1Sa 6:6

## B. DAVID

- 1. He held a sling and five smooth stones -1Sa 17:40
- 2. God used these to destroy Goliath

#### C. THE SMALL BOY

- 1. He held five loaves and two fish -Jn 6:9
- 2. Jesus used this to feed five-thousand men not counting the women and children

## II. WHAT WE HAVE IN OUR HANDS

## A. TIME

- 1. God gives man time to repent
  - a. He desires all to come to the knowledge of the truth -1Ti 2:4
  - b. He isn't willing that any should perish -2Pe 3:9
- 2. God gives man time to work (to please Him)
  - a. We are to redeem the time -Ep 5:16
  - b. Jesus said that He must work while it is day -Jn 9:4

#### B. TALENT

- 1. Everyone has a talent or ability –Mt 25:14-ff
- 2. Using what we have can involve our opportunities.

# C. GOSPEL

- 1. The gospel is the power of God to salvation -Ro 1:16
- 2. The power is in the message, not the messenger –He 4:12
- 3. When we plant the seed, we succeed -2Pe 2:5

## Conclusion:

- 1. Remember it is not what we have, but what we do with what we have that makes the difference.
- 2. Let our goal be to use what we have for God.
